Our Learning					
Class	This week we have	Next week we will			
Rowan	This week we have been writing a version of Oliver Twist asking for more in the workhouse! We have really got into character. In Maths we have completed ratio and looked at problem solving using recipes. In PSHE we have begun working towards our young leader award by exploring what makes a good leader. We have also enjoyed our golden collage work in the style of Gustav Klimt and designing our soup recipes.	Next week we are beginning our ukulele unit in music. In science, we are continuing to explore forces and their effect on objects. In History we will be learning about why the Romans wanted to expand their empire by invading Britain. In Maths we are embarking onto algebra while in English we are continuing our work on Oliver Twist.			
Syca- more	This week we have continued our topic by looking at the chronology of the Shang Dynasty compared to other significant historical epochs. Continuing with the East Asian theme, we have read more of The Firework Maker's Daughter and this is now providing the basis for our narrative re-write of the story. We have looked at various writing skills to contribute to this piece and we are now building up our bank of sophisticated sentence structures and vocabulary. In Maths, we have begun our fractions unit by exploring and calculating equivalent fractions. In science the children have been exploring the effect of air resistance as part of their forces unit. Our art unit this half term is collage and the class have begun exploring the effect of different materials in building up an exploratory piece. Sycamore's PE lessons this week have been on dodgeball and badminton.	Next week, we will be exploring what was distinctive about Shang people's beliefs. Writing will be continuing to build sentences towards our narrative piece. In maths we will continue with comparing and ordering unit and non-unit fractions. Our reading lessons will be a combination of further examination of The Firework Maker's Daughter and reading skills lessons. The PE and art we will be continuing the work begun this week.			
Maple	This week in Maths we have been learning how to use a written method for division. In SPaG we have been developing our knowledge of powerful verbs. In spelling we have been focussing on the prefixes -in and dis The children have examples of the words we are learning in their link books. In PSHE we have been discussing the importance of leading a healthy lifestyle.	Next week in Maths we will be beginning our new topic 'Fractions'. In Spanish we will be learning the names of different animals and adjectives that could be used to describe them eg. es grande. In DT we will continue our work linked to food and nutrition, as we find out why it is important to eat fruit and vegetables			
Oak	This week, we have enjoyed exploring our story 'Little Red Riding Hood' by talking about the character of the wolf. The children enjoyed thinking of adjectives to describe the wolf such as 'sneaky' and 'dangerous'. They used their Fred Fingers to sound out and write their describing words on their pictures. In our topic work, we discussed how toys have changed over the years and categorised pictures of toys into old and new. The children noticed how a lot of the old toys were made out of wood and nothing needed electricity	Next week, we will be exploring the number 7 and thinking of the different representations such as rainbows! We will also be continuing to compare old and new toys by thinking about our favourite toy from the present and comparing it with on from the past. In our Literacy work, we will be sequencing the story of Little Red Riding Hood by making a story map.

Motorists in Britain could be completing journeys using driverless cars by 2026 the transport secretary, Mark Harper, has predicted. 
