
## Our Learning

Class	This week we have	Next week we will	
Rowan	Rowan class have conducted themselves exceptionally during this week. We have visited two different schools for art and sport opportunities and welcomed visitors into our own school. In Science we have investigated air resistance and tested our parachute prototypes. In Maths we have entered the world of algebra and experienced success with substitution. During English, we have continued our foray into Oliver Twist with some fabulous writing.	Next week we are looking forward to developing our understanding of the Romans, making seasonal soups and developing our collage work. We will be looking further into our young leader projects and getting prepared for internet safety week.	
Syca- more	This week, the children have been learning about beliefs during the Shang Dynasty era. This continues to build up our knowledge of historical China which feeds into our reading book (The Firework Maker's Daughter) and our adventure story writing. In maths we have finished working on equivalent fractions and have been looking at improper fractions and mixed numbers. The class have continued learning about forces in science and have enjoyed dodgeball on Friday afternoon.	Next week we will learn about Shang Dynasty oracles - the process through which they divined the future. In writing, we will finish our sentence chunk work and skills preparation and will write up our adventure stories. We will also be finishing our class book. In maths we will be looking at comparing and ordering unit and non-unit fractions. The class will be doing further work on collage - identifying a subject, examining and sketching in detail and then recreating in collage. We will be very much looking forward to our number themed day next Friday.	
Maple	What a busy week we have had! This week, we have started our new unit on fractions in maths, looking at the difference between unit and non-unit fractions and ordering them based on their denominators. In English, we have been writing persuasive letters to Mrs Lamb to convince her to let us have a Romans workshop on Monday we can't wait to find out if we have persuaded her! We have continued our collage work in art by recreating the work of Victor Vasarely, and we have enjoyed dodgeball in PE.	Next week, we will hopefully be starting the week with a Romans workshop where we dive deeper into what life was like for around our local area during the Roman period. In maths, we will be exploring equivalent fractions and ordering fractions on number lines. In art, we will be creating our own versions of work inspired by the artist Henri Mattise. We are also looking forward to coming in comfy/maths clothes on Friday to support Sheffield Children's Hospital. Please don't forget your donation!	
Silver Birch	We have had great week in Silver Birch. In Maths we multiplied numbers by 10 and recognised multiples of 10. In English we have begun to write a question and answer text about Neil Armstrong and learnt about the spelling rule of doubling the final consonant when adding a suffix to a word with a short vowel sound, eg fun -funny! Oak joined us for an exciting PE session and we looked at the work of optical illusion artist Bridget Riley.	Next week we will multiply 2 digit numbers using apparatus to support us and we will continue with writing our questions and answer text. In Art we will create an optical illusion inspired collage and in computing, programme a route for the beebots.	
Beech	This week we have been writing and publishing our poems. In Maths, Y1 have been estimating on number lines to 50 and Y2 have been counting in multiples of 10. In our Art we have been creating collages of our initials, using contrasting textures of paper. We had a wonderful time at the Fire Station, finding out about the service and equipment, and how this has changed over the years.	Next week we are going to be writing thank you letters to the fire service. In Maths, Y1 will be looking at length and height and Y2 are continuing with multiplication. In PE we will be doing badminton and exploring shapes in gymnastics.	
Oak	This week, we have enjoyed using lots of art materials to build on our collaging skills. The children created a big wolf picture dressed in Grandma clothes using tissue paper and scrunching up paper. We have also been exploring collage within provision by using magazines to cut our images and stick onto paper, creating our own patterns and designs. We have also explored the number 7 this week by looking at different representations and creating a weekly timetable to understand how there are 7 days in our week.	Next week, we will be finishing off our Little Red Riding Hood story by creating storyboards and retelling the story using images and writing some simple words. We will also be continuing with our comparisons of new and old toys, exploring how they have changed and which toys we would prefer to play with. We will also be continuing with our learning of the number 7 by understanding how amounts can be too many or too little and working out how many we would need to add or take away.
