Class	This week we have	Next week we will
Rowan	Rowan class have had yet another busy week! We have designed, made and evaluated our own seasonal soups which used our skills of peeling and chopping, as well as designing a soup which used a variety of food groups from the Eatwell plate. We have also tested our parachutes which we designed to have the greatest air resistance. In English, we have written up our Oliver narrative and a character description of Fagin. In Maths we have enjoyed number day and have also completed our first set of Sats papers to see what they are like. In Music we have begun practising ukulele chords.	We hope that next week is a relaxing week for you all. When we return, we will be learning more about the Romans and completing our art unit on collage. We will also be enjoying a trip to Ryedale School to see the Snow Queen and getting to grips further with micro-bits.
Syca- more	This week in Sycamore we have been planning our adventure stories in writing, ready to write-up when we return.  In maths, we have been comparing and ordering fractions with a particular emphasis on finding the lowest common multiple to make the denominators comparable. The children have also worked on forces in science and we have begun our ukelele unit in music. The children have really enjoyed our comfy clothing / number day today, particularly extra time to work on maths on laptops and finding out interesting and unusual maths facts. They have also completed some brilliant still-life art work.	After half-term, we will be moving into biographies in writing, lookin at non-fiction texts as our class book and in maths we will be continuing to work on fractions. In art, we will be finishing off our work on collages and looking at self-care and healthy choices in PSHE. Music will continue to be working with ukeleles and we will be continuing twork on our current history topic of the Shang Dynasty. The children have worked so very hard this half-term and I hope they enjoy their well-earned break!
Maple	Maple class thoroughly enjoyed their Roman workshop on Monday. They learnt about everyday life during the Roman period and even tried on some Roman costumes.  This week in Maths we have been learning about unit and non-unit fractions. In SPaG we have been consolidating our knowledge of conjunctions and how to use them effectively within our everyday writing. In spelling we have been focussing on the suffix -ous. The children have examples of the words we are learning in their linkbooks. In PSHE we discussed the importance of internet safety. Have a super half term!	After half term in Maths, we will be revisiting 'Fractions' and moving onto decimals. In Spanish we will be learning how to pronounce the different colours . In SPaG we will be learning how to use apostrophes for plural possession.
Silver Birch	This week we have finished writing a question and answer text about the Wright brothers. In maths we have been using counters and times tables to multiply and divide two digit numbers. We made posters about being safe on the internet as it was Internet Safety awareness day on the 6 <sup>th</sup> February. In art we created collages inspired by Bridget Riley.	Next term we will begin units on shape and fractions in maths. We will be story writing in English and we are looking forward to startin our DT unit, investigating fillings and making sandwiches.  I do hope you all have a restful half term and continue to read and practise maths on numbats and tt rockstars.
Beech	This week we have enjoyed taking part in the Big School Birdwatch. In English we have been writing sentences for our story based on 'The Last Stop on Market Street.' We have also written thank you letters to the fire service. In Science, Y2 have been investigating habitats and finding out which plants and animals depend on each other. Y1 have been exploring materials and objects. We took part in Safer Internet Day and found out about ways to stay safe online. Have a lovely half term everyone!	After half term we will be writing stories in English. We will continue with our Great Fire of London topic. In DT we will be planning our smoothies and in Art we will be looking at textiles.
Oak	This week, we have been finishing off our story of 'Little Red Riding Hood' by creating sequencing maps as we retell the story. The children thought carefully about the four parts of the story they wanted to include and retold their story to an adult using amazing language! We have also discussed the importance of being safe when on a tablet, compared old and new toys and rounded off our learning on the number 7 by creating our maths posters.	After half term, we will be moving onto a new traditional tale, Goldilocks and the Three Bears! We will also be continuing with our History topic and be learning all about the life of Queen Elizabeth II as she was a significant person within Grandma Ada's life. Within our math work next term, we will be learning all about the numbers 8 and 9 alongside having a focus week on identifying weight and comparing heavy and light objects.


This week during our Newsday Tuesday assembly we discussed...



45-year-old Mar Galcerán from Spain has become the country's first elected parliamentarian with Down's syndrome. Maria del Mar Galcerán Gadea is thought to be the first person with the genetic disorder to join a European regional or national parliament. She has been involved with politics since she was 18, when she joined Spain's conservative People's Party. Speaking to the media, Mar Galcerán said she wants to be seen as a person, and not for her disability.
