Syca- more	This week the class have finished up their work as part of this term's global curriculum unit, including art work, D&T, class books and newspaper writing. We have also finished the main section of our fractions unit, although this will be revisited after the holidays when we work on decimals and percentages. On Wednesday, the class celebrated the festival of Holi during which they made fudge and produced some beautiful art work. In PE, to conclude their badminton unit, Sycamore competed in house team matches.	When we come back after the holidays, our topic will have shifted to a geography unit. We will be studying geographical features of Italy. Writing will include non-fiction texts such as persuasive travel brochures. In maths, we will be revisiting some multiplication and division before looking at decimal fractions with percentages. In science, the children will be studying living things and their habitats.
Maple	This week, we have been focusing on sustainability and helping the planet within global. We have created artwork on endangered animals and looked at things we can do at home to help. In DT, we have enjoyed making our sandwiches and have evaluated the taste. On Wednesday, we celebrated the Hindu festival of Holi by writing an acrostic poem. We have celebrated Easter through creating a whole class piece of art and have made Easter cards.	After the holidays, we will be starting our decimals unit in maths. In topic, we will be looking at Modern Europe in geography. In English, we will be looking at writing and performing play scripts. In music, we will continue our sessions with Mrs Durant. Have a lovely Easter!
Silver Birch	This highlight of our Global learning week was our trip to Helmsley Walled Garden. We had an amazing time looking for signs of spring, sketching nature in the outdoors and feeding the chickens. It was an added bonus to be able to have an ice cream on the way back to school! It inspired some fabulous writing, which was based around writing a letter to the earth and talking about the amazing sights in nature that we would love to witness. It has been a great end to the term which also included learning a Holi (Hindu festival) dance alongside recapping the Easter story.	Next term new topics will begin, including story writing, Shape and Measures topics in Maths, a Geography topic named Hills and mountains and Science topics based on plants. We have all worked so hard this term and all deserve break. I wish everyone a happy and restful holiday.
Beech	We have had a busy week in Beech class! During our global curriculum work we have been writing about recycling and looking at the symbols linked to waste and recyclable products. During our Holi festival day, we found out about the celebrations and created coloured fabrics using brusho and water. We have also read the Easter story and created a class collage of the last supper and made Easter cards. Have a lovely Easter holiday!	After Easter, we will launch our new topic 'weather experts' where we will study our seasonal and daily weather patterns In Maths we will be starting our unit of work on fractions and we will begin by exploring half of an object, shape or quantity. Our writing work will focus on traditional tales.
Oak	This week, we have been enjoyed learning about the Easter Story and creating a collaborative image of Palm Sunday. We have also been learning about Holi and how this colourful festival is celebrated. We enjoyed using powder paints to create signs by throwing the paint at wet paper. In our Global work this week, we have been discussing Fairtrade and working on a large floor map to see where some of our fruit and vegetables come from.	After half term, we will be beginning our new topic; 'An African Adventure'. We are excited about our upcoming trip to Flamingo Land and to learn all about African animals and the country they live in. We will be moving onto numbers to 10 and we will be learning our number bonds to 10. We are loo ing forward to also learning some new special friends in our phonics and building on our writing skills.


Well done to all children who performed with pride for their teams!


